- 1. Simone Collins Landscape Architecture (SC) gave a presentation that reviewed feedback received during the second Public Meeting, preliminary results of the public opinion survey, and analysis performed thus far, including:
 - community facilities benchmarking,
 - staffing and budgeting benchmarking,
 - other Allentown planning efforts currently underway,
 - park service areas and gaps,
 - the functions of an Official Map, and
 - staff interviews, as well as
 - next steps in the project.
- 2. A committee member stated that the survey questions seem too leading and do not provide opportunities for open-ended feedback.
 - a. PJ responded that many questions did provide room for open-ended responses and that the survey has a combination of question styles with some more open-ended than others.
- 3. A committee member asked if LANTA could be involved in planning for the SS4A and Active Transportation Plan.

- a. PJ responded that yes, LANTA is a great partner for community involvement and is involved in the network of improvements that form these planning efforts.
- **4.** A committee member asked how equity plays into the service areas of parks. They noted that there are demographic factors that may increase the need for parks in some areas.
 - a. The committee member asked if the park service area map could be overlaid with crime data or delinquency data to better understand where to address public safety issues.
 - b. RG responded the consultant team is working to acquire and map additional data on various social determinants of health and other demographic data than could impact the need for parks, such as population density.
 - c. Another committee member asked if age distribution could also be overlain on the park service area maps.
 - d. RG responded that age distribution data will be included.
- 5. A committee member asked if the committee would be able to join for the park site visits.
 - a. PJ responded that SC will coordinate site visits with the committee.
 - b. RG added that if there is information that committee members would like to share about any of the city's parks, please do not hesitate to share.
- 6. A committee member asked if Lehigh Carbon Community College would be included in the KPI's.
 - a. PJ responded that yes, they will be included in the KPI with other colleges and universities and thanked the committee member for the recommendation.
